◆ What is the Point-Rating System (PRS)?

The point-rating system is an assessment approach in which your academic performance is evaluated throughout the entire semester, not only during the final exam. You accumulate points progressively for all types of academic work.

◆ Overall Grading Scale

- Maximum score per course: **100 points**
- Points are accumulated as follows:
 - Ongoing assessment — up to 40 points
 - Mid-term 1 — up to 20 points
 - Mid-term 2 — up to 20 points
 - Final exam — up to 20 points

◆ What Makes Up Your Score?

☑ Ongoing assessment includes:

- homework (notes, essays, presentations)
- in-class work
- SRW (Self-directed work)
- participation and activity

SRW (Self-Directed Work)

◆ Includes:

- preparation and writing of essays and reports
- creation of presentations (slides)
- defense/presentation of completed work
- submission of work via the **Ebilim system**

Important to Know!

- ¶ Only students who have completed all ongoing and mid-term assessments are allowed to take the final exam
- ¶ A minimum of **16 points** is required for exam admission
- ¶ Students with missed classes must complete all missed work before being admitted to the final assessment

Assessment Timeline

- Mid-term 1 — middle of the semester
- Mid-term 2 — end of the semester
- Final exam — during the examination session

If You Miss an Assessment

In case of a valid reason:


- submit a written application
- provide supporting documents
